# What to Do a Year After the FCC's Repeal of Net Neutrality Regulations?




#### Let's Establish Some Common Ground

- Original Purpose of the Internet created by DARPA in mid 60's to allow computers to communicate with each other in the event of a nuclear attack.
- Purpose of the Internet Today share information between connected devices (computers)
- Net Neutrality principle that data packets on the Internet should be moved impartially, without regard to content, destination or source (FCC)

### Internet's Challenge




## ISP's Perspective - \$\$\$




For unlimited \$\$\$ - we'll provide unlimited Speed & Availability

Content Provider's Perspective -



We'll pay to put content INTO the network, ISP's will deliver it

## End User's Perspective - Access



I'll pay to connect, ISP must ensure content I want arrives quickly

# Two Perspectives on Reconciling These Conflicting Views

#### **Technical (Geeks)**

- Build, build, build
- Hardware 'Tricks'
   Content Peering Sites
- Software prioritize traffic by source by type of traffic

#### **Social (Politicians)**

- Treat Networks as Infrastructure
  - Subsidize for Public Good
  - Regulate via Legislation
- Let the Free Market decide
